Dear friends,

We will soon celebrate the Reformation. In 2017, we will celebrate the 500th anniversary of that incredible time in the history of our Church and the history of the world. Every Reformation Sunday we remember and give thanks to God for Martin Luther and those with him who recovered the central truth of Christianity, “we are saved by grace through faith in the Crucified and Risen Christ.”

I recently revisited the following words. I have shared them before but decided to print them again for our newsletter because they are words you just might want to read over again and again. Written by Robert Capon in his book “Between Noon and Three” Capon gives us something worthy of serious contemplation. If you are like me you might need to read these words through a couple of times in order to fully grasp what Pastor Capon is telling us.

“If we are ever to enter fully into the glorious liberty of the sons and daughters of God, we are going to have to spend more time thinking about freedom than we do. The church, by and large, has a poor record of encouraging freedom. She has spent so much time inculcating in us the fear of making mistakes that she has made us like ill-taught piano students; we play our songs, but we never really hear them, because our main concern is not to make music, but to avoid some flub that will get us in trouble. As a result all too often we live feeling we deserve God’s wrath for our failings in living out perfectly the Christian Faith we profess to guide our lives.

The law of retribution reigns supreme in our fantasies precisely to keep us off the main question of our lives: What would you do with freedom if you had it?


St. Paul had not said to you, “Think how it would be if there were no condemnation”; he has said, “There is therefore now none.” He had made an unconditional, not a conditional statement---a flat assertion, not a parabolic one. He simply said, “you are free. There is therefore no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus.....” Again in Roman 6, St. Paul reminds us that we have baptized into Christ Jesus’ death and resurrection, so that we might walk in newness of life.

It is essential that think this question through carefully. “What would you do with freedom if you had it? Only now it is stated. In Christ you have been made free, what do you plan to do?”

Pastor Capon reminds of the wonder of living a life surrounded by the compassionate grace of God, living a life of faith, called to trust that salvation has come in the person of Jesus. His question is a good one. Now that you don’t have to worry about your salvation, what will you do with that glorious freedom? It’s a question worth our time.

All donations are appreciated no matter how big or small."


